Suggested funding topics are:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) Screening, testing and treatment tools and protocols for COVID-19 related health care 2) Impact of the social determinants of health on the COVID-19 pandemic (e.g., stigma of positive patients and vulnerable populations such as the elderly, people of color, and rural populations) 3) Self-Care of Health Care Professions (Quadruple Aim)/Resiliency Training <p>....</p> <p>AHEC Scholars Program</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) For the 2020-22 cohort we have 24 applicants 2) Desire 2 Learn (D2L) – UA’s learning management system which will be utilized as a non-credit/community course for cohort/group collaborations 3) Virtual meetings for mentors will be offered to field questions throughout the cohort year. A schedule is still being developed. 4) Mentor Placements have been made, lists will be sent to all shortly. Ana Mendez will be able to finish out scholar year through this summer and will work with new mentor (Renee Gregg) on transition. <p>Pharmacy has seen challenges recruiting for scholars’ program due to inability to recruit for RHPP rotations. Trying to create virtual remote rotations, but still would not have patient contact which creates challenges when trying to meet learning objectives. 	<p>COM-T program has placed 22 of 24 students in rural experiences. With a little creativity participants are getting experience without being directly in contact with patients.</p> <p>CON-UA has seen many challenges for students who have been trying to finish school, balance family needs, and being on the front lines with work. Working on third round of recruitment and finding that timing is key.</p> <p>CON NAU has been struggling with placements also, 10 placed – 1 in Tucson needs placement. Has found alternating weeks with students at placements helps them get the hours in they need. Utilizing personal contacts has helped with placements. Jonathan and Shelley will work on a collaboration document that will indicate type of placement needs and placements that may be available to help place students.</p> <p>CPH has the same recruitment challenges, but have extended their application deadline. Border health learning will be going online in August. Other service learning courses are being pushed to Winter and Spring offerings.</p> <p>Current FY budgets will be extended for 60 days to August 31. For next FY budgets will still begin on July 1. These budgets should include all expenses for next FY and any carry-over for this year. Call for proposals will be going out shortly.</p> <p>NAHEC plans to continue social distancing for all programs for the next 6 months. Reduced housing accommodations to total of 3 which places one person in each room.
