Discussion	<p>Each center provided an overview of the AHEC Scholars immersion two day immersion scheduled for February 6-7, 2021.</p> <p>CAAHEC Immersion will allow AHEC Scholars to continue work with the Casa Grande community and the community center; which will include both pre/post immersion activities.</p> <p>SEAHEC Immersion will focus on the Winchester Heights Community and food security within farm worker families. Scholars will design a food security assessment; partnering with Cochise County Health Department and Chiricahua Community.</p> <p>EAHEC Immersion will focus on the community mental health disparities within Safford, AZ located in Graham County. This will include panelists and a virtual windshield tour.</p> <p>WAHEC Immersion activities are still being developed; will include windshield survey and community assessments of farming community.</p> <p>NAHEC Immersion will include virtual windshield survey focusing on case studies of community members and access to resources within the community.</p> <p>Some remaining funds in the COVID Scholars project have made it possible for CAAHEC to add some additional activities. CAAHEC COVID Scholars have an opportunity to work with Gallup Indian Medical Center on the Navajo Nation. Volunteers would help with contact tracing, hotline, vaccinations, and the patient hotel program. CON-UA has identified 6 students and 2 faculty who will assist with in-person volunteering/service learning at this location. Additionally, there are two other COVID Scholar student volunteer opportunities working with contact tracing and assisting Maricopa County Medical Society to identify and contact private practices for point of contact and vaccine distribution.
